Everybody's Talking!

Sandscape dream: A wide park of pale-colored sand dunes hides countless clear pools of freshwater in a remote corner of Maranhão, Brazil. These sky-like lagoons appear in the rainy season, forming between tall, wind-shaped hills of sand. Unlike a desert, the area receives steady rainfall, creating a strange mix of dry sand and still water. Small villages nestled in the dunes offer calm spots for quiet walks or gentle river rides through mangroves and palm trees. Many visitors walk barefoot over soft dunes or explore on 4x4's, reaching pools far from the busy areas. From above, the scene looks like wrinkled bedsheets dotted with blue. On the ground, the quiet makes the area feel like a peaceful, hidden world.

Receipt rebellion: By giving its food names like "Basic Steel Stapler" and "Wireless Mouse," instead of the burgers and fries that they really were, a burger restaurant in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, grabbed attention. The gimmick was part of a tongue-in-cheek campaign meant to joke about slipping meals onto work expense reports. People ordering lunch could pretend they were expensing office supplies while really getting a burger combo. Though clearly not meant to fool accountants, the idea quickly went viral through online videos. The restaurant later clarified it was all in good fun, not a real scheme. Even so, it sparked lively debate over whether the joke was harmless or a little too close to crossing the line.

Flood fortress: In Tokyo, Japan, a massive underground structure quietly protects the city from increasingly intense rainfall and flooding. Nicknamed "The Cathedral" for its towering stone pillars and hushed atmosphere, the chamber sits beneath a network of tunnels built to hold and redirect floodwater. Overflow from rivers is channeled underground before being safely pumped out to sea. The system has saved homes and prevented widespread damage in the region. Its cool, misty interior resembles a sacred space and has even become a destination for curious visitors. Engineers are now expanding the system further, which is proof that Tokyo is preparing for what's coming, not waiting for it.

Pocket win: A young girl in Ipswich, England, sparked change after noticing her school trousers had fake pockets, while the boys' version had real ones. Frustrated by the lack of function, she wrote to a major clothing retailer and started a petition with dozens of signatures from classmates. Though the company didn't officially credit her efforts, new girls' trousers now include stitched bows and proper pockets. The company later responded by saying their designs focus on comfort and durability, without directly explaining the update. For the girl who raised her voice, the issue was simple: pockets matter to everyone. Whether or not her letter led to the shift, the shelves now speak for themselves.



Recipe of the Week

Downeast Maine Pumpkin Bread

1 (15 ounce) can pumpkin puree
4 eggs
1 cup vegetable oil
2/3 cup water
3 cups white sugar
3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking soda
1 1/2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
1/4 teaspoon ground ginger

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease and flour three 7x3 inch loaf pans.

2. In a large bowl, mix together pumpkin puree, eggs, oil, water and sugar until well blended. In a separate bowl, whisk together the flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves and ginger. Stir the dry ingredients into the pumpkin mixture until just blended. Pour into the prepared pans.

3. Bake for about 50 minutes in the preheated oven. Loaves are done when toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. source: allrecipes.com
